ASCG's busiest training period in the history of the company

The Training Team at ASCG are coming up for air following the company's busiest training period since its formation.

During April and May 2010, the team were training to maximum capacity delivering a range of third party training solutions to its airline customers. On some occasions Active Aviation Training & Consulting had over 20 instructors delivering training in up to 6 different locations in 4 different countries across 3 continents. In all, over 500 cabin crew were trained.

Training was delivered at both London Heathrow and London Gatwick Airports as well as in Paris on behalf of airlines that included British Airways, Air New Zealand, Openskies (the British Airways' subsidiary), Astraeus, Easyjet and Virgin Atlantic. Training included both Initial and Recurrent training, involving aircraft types which included Boeing 747, Boeing 757, Boeing 777 and Airbus A319/320 family.

ASCG's new training brand "Active Plane Training" recently received UK Civil Aviation Authority approval to deliver training and issue the European EU OPS 1 Cabin Crew Attestation and open courses are taking place at the company's London Gatwick Airport Training Centre in July and August 2010.

Customer Service and quality assurance remained the company's strongest focus during a very exciting period and the company continued providing support to all its customers with the administration and organisation of facilities, transport for delegates and planning of course programmes. CEO of ASCG, Donahue Cortes, commented on "the amazing team work that demonstrated the capabilities of the company and its people to achieve and surpass customer expectations regardless of the organisational cultures and varying needs that were presented to the team over an 8 week period".

ASCG have provided classroom and training facilities at their own training base in Crawley, close to London Gatwick Airport, with their new larger classrooms already being used by airlines such as Easyjet.
